#### SG KINTA RIVER EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Sg Kinta River Education Programme under the W.A.T.E.R (Working Actively Through Education and Rehabilitation) Project was initiated in 2012 with the support of DID Perak and Kinta, MBI, JPNIN and UTAR to outreach to the local communities, education institutions and **Business** organization.

The objectives of the programme are to empower and further strengthen the targeted groups and other stakeholders by education, knowledge sharing and skills on river monitoring and awareness programme.



### **EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS**



An Education and Awareness Programme for 120 students of SK Raja Perempuan conducted on 5th October 2016 with the support of MBI. The half-day programme includes talk on River Care and Monitoring Programme followed with exhibition as well as demonstration on Waste Management Initiatives.

Fifty (50) students of SMK Sains Tapah trained as RIV-ER Ranger on 9th October 2016. The half-day training includes the RIVER Ranger Presentation and hands on river audit – river report card, chemical water quality, and Bio monitoring. The training was organised at Kuala Woh Recreational Forest

# **RCEC AND YOUTH PROGRAMME**

- Outreach at KRT Tmn Pertama on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2016 focusing on River Water Quality and Zero Waste Concept Management.
- Outreach at UiTM Sri Iskandar on 6th November 2016 supported by the JPNIN Kinta. The Youths invited to share their expertise on river water quality monitoring and on the waste management towards alternative income.
- On 19th November 2016, the annual open day was organised at KRT Buntong 3&4, where four (4) schools attended the open day. The open day was an outreach programme to engage the other schools to venture into environmental programmes as part of the co-curriculum engagement.



# RIVER INITIATIVE

To educate and create awareness among the public on the river care programme, DID Kinta built a new steps to the river to accommodate the public's needs, and in order to protect the river, signage on what to Do and Don't at the river bank will be installed under the project.

A few initiatives as installation of log boom , installation of rubbish trap as well as wetland cells recommended however after detailed study the proposed initiatives was not possible for implementation due to the hydrological condition of the proposed river stretch near the Kalumalai temple.
